LIFE RESTRAINED

This all happened on Friday, the day of preparation, the day before the Sabbath. As evening approached, Joseph of Arimathea took a risk and went to Pilate and asked for Jesus' body. (Joseph was an honored member of the high council, and he was waiting for the Kingdom of God to come.) Pilate couldn't believe that Jesus was already dead, so he called for the Roman officer and asked if he had died yet. The officer confirmed that Jesus was dead, so Pilate told Joseph he could have the body. Joseph bought a long sheet of linen cloth. Then he took Jesus' body down from the cross, wrapped it in the cloth, and laid it in a tomb that had been carved out of the rock. Then he rolled a stone in front of the entrance. Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joseph saw where Jesus' body was laid. Mark 15:42-47

Have you ever driven by the Hearthside nursing home? I have, countless times, always on my way somewhere else. I rarely thought about the people inside. But recently, my Life Group decided to spend an evening visiting with the residents there – and for the first time, the Hearthside became my destination...

Ernest, a Hearthside employee and our guide for the evening, greeted us warmly and first led us into a room where we met 94-year old "Helen" along with her daughter at her bedside. Helen's daughter lovingly and proudly shared snippets of her mom's life with us; Helen looked on, interested in the conversation and aware of our presence, but unable to communicate verbally. Suddenly, Helen's daughter asked, "Do you sing hymns?" Well, not typically, I wanted to say, but in no time at all she whipped out her iPad and called up "Victory in Jesus" for our backing track. Ready or not, we were going to sing a hymn! To be sure, it was not the most rousing rendition of that song ever performed, but as we stammered along with the music, I could see a change come over Helen. That old hymn touched her in a deep way -- in a way that conversation could not. As our group turned to leave, I walked over to Helen and took her hand in mine. While looking into my eyes, she squeezed back with a grip astonishing for a 94-year old woman, and she would not let go. As she continued to grasp my hand, she tried to say something to me. I could not understand her words... but words were unnecessary.

For the next hour and a half, Ernest led us into room after room, splitting us up and moving us along at a good pace in an effort to allow us to visit with as many folks as possible. It is likely that most of the people we met rarely, if ever, get visitors. They are lonely, forgotten, and longing for connection.

The simplicity of that evening startled me, because all we did was show up, prayerfully, with the desire to love others with His love. I don't know what seeds were planted or watered as we prayed, or touched, or listened to the people there... but God does, and I am grateful to have been a part of it.

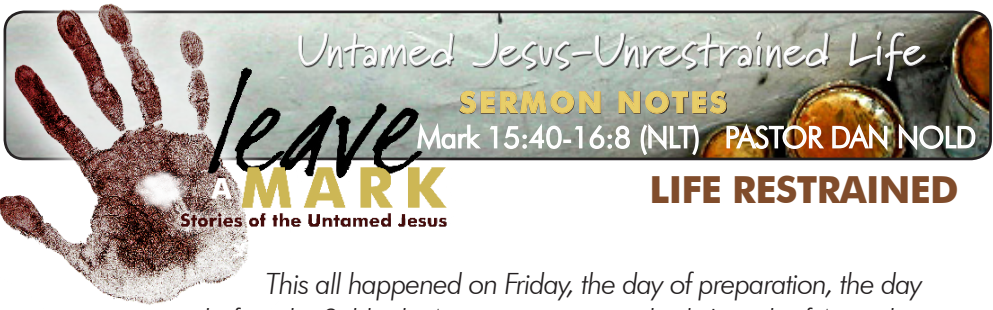
